From Concept to Sustainability

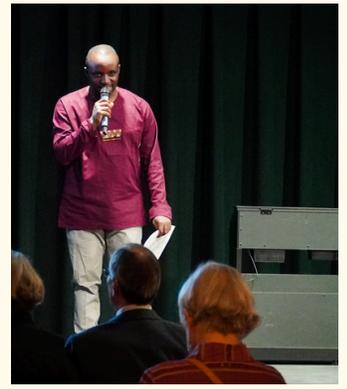

We are grateful for the support of all those around the globe who helped realize this vision.

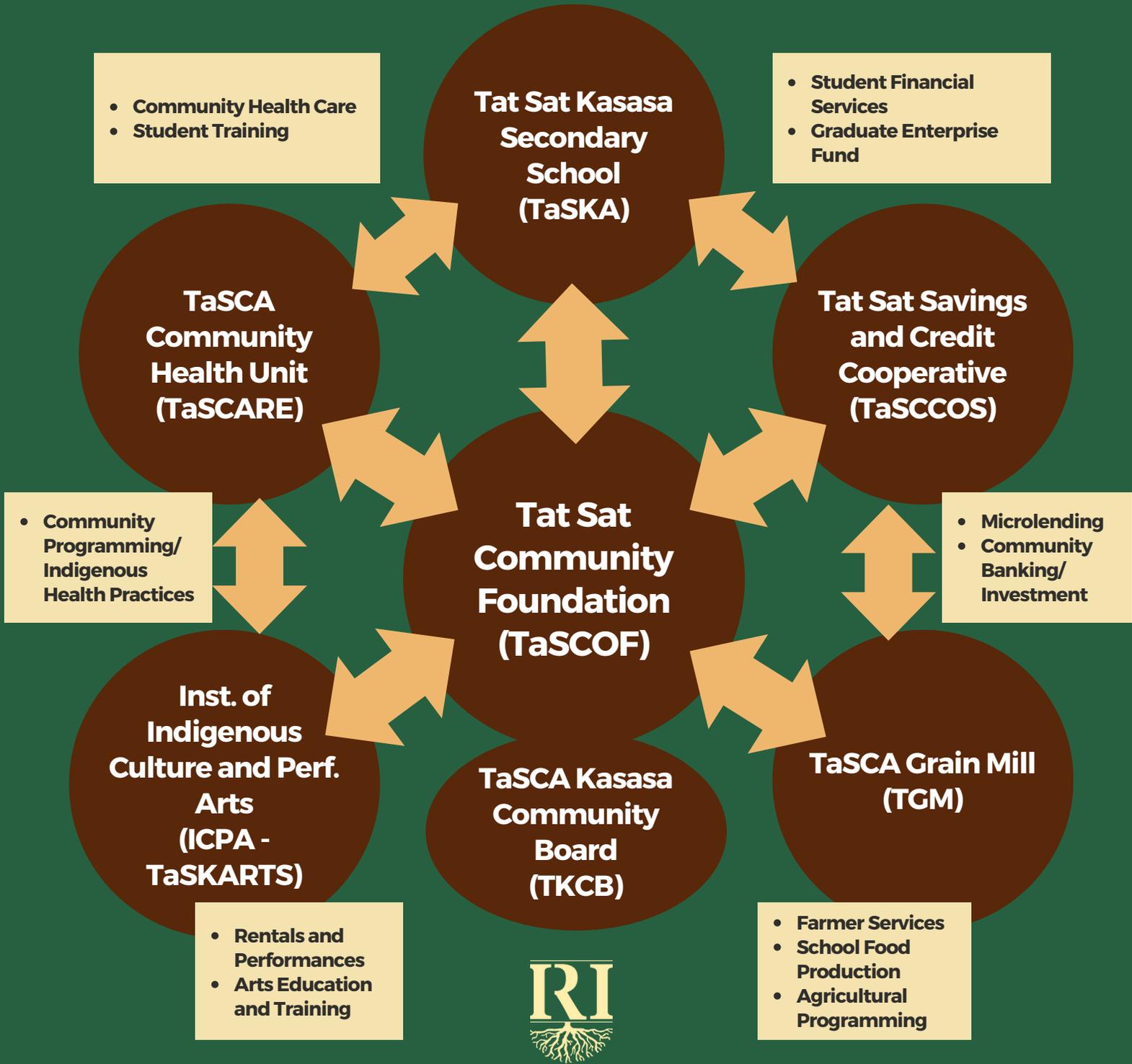
The community of Kasasa, Uganda has accomplished something incredible that will impact generations to come.
